- January 25th
 - National holiday to commemorate the police forces
 - Estimated 25,000 to 30,000 Egyptians on the streets of Cairo as well as in Alexandria, Mansoura, and Suez






- January 28th
 - SMS services gone...
 - ... followed by DSL...
 - ... then 3G and mobile communication services
 - Government warns that protesters will be severely dealt with on national TV











- January 29th
 - Mubarak delivers first speech
 - Cabinet sacked
 - VP appointed
 - Martial law
 - Curfew
 - DEMONSTRATIONS CONTINUE!!





- February 1st
 - Mubarak declares he will not run for re-election but refuses to step down
 - Mobile communications and Internet services resume
- February 2nd
 - Pro-Mubarak demonstrations take place in Mohandiseen
 - The worst day of violence with thugs and snipers attacking pro-democracy protesters in #Tahrir





- February 4th February 10th
 - Demonstrators begin to camp out in #Tahrir Sq.
 - Pressure both at home and abroad grows on Mubarak to step down
 - Announcement that Mubarak will give a speech on Feb
 10th highly anticipated




