New gTLDs

- Public policy issues:
 - Fairness, transparency, accountability
 - Promoting consumer choice and competition
 - DNS Stability
 - Public order issues



New gTLDs

- Fairness, transparency, accountability
 - Procedures need to be objective and justified
 - Decisions need to be open to public scrutiny
 - Adequate appeal procedures



New gTLDs

- Promoting consumer choice and competition
 - How to facilitate new entrants to the market?
 - Barriers to entry: any restrictions need to be justified
 - Should the market determine TLD success?



New gTLDs

- DNS Stability
 - How many new TLDs can be introduced?
 - What is the impact on root server operators?
 - Is business failure of a TLD a “stability” issue?



New gTLDs

- Public order issues
 - Obscene or offensive strings: how can we agree on what is obscene or offensive?
 - Content-related issues?
 - Geographic names:
 - Country names only?
 - Other geographic identifiers?
 - Which languages?
 - IDNS?



New gTLDs

- **What role should the GAC have?**
 - GAC is an advisory body
 - GAC should limit itself to public policy issues
 - GAC principles should offer framework guidance that is “future proof”
 - Should GAC be involved in the selection process unless “something goes wrong”?

GAC principles

- First draft circulated after Vancouver
- Third draft after Sao Paulo
- Objective to adopt in Lisbon
- IDNs



New gTLDs

GAC principles

- General framework guidance based on:
 - ICANN's core values
 - WSIS provisions
- Some specifics:
 - Geographic names
 - No two/three letter ISO codes
