
Recent Milestones in IPv4 Activity

15 Apr 2011: Final rationed IPv4 address space in

IPv4 Depletion: APNIC Experience

Preparations

- Education and community outreach
- IP address requests processing changed from parallel to serial

Down to the last /8 - 15 April 2011

- Final rationed IPv4 address space in APNIC
- Maximum allocation size = /22 (~1K addresses)

Ongoing work

- IP transfers within region
- IP transfers between regions

Global Proposals - Compared

Global Proposal	RIR return of address space to IANA	RIR Eligibility
GPP-IPv4-2009	Mandatory	Need based
GPP-IPv4-2010	Voluntary	Need based
GPP-IPv4-2011	Voluntary	Equal distribution to RIRs



ASO Workshop: Global Proposals

[GPP-IPv4-2011] Global Policy for post exhaustion IPv4 allocation mechanisms by the IANA

- Allows IANA to receive address space from the RIRs
- Allows IANA to allocate space back to the RIRs
- Status:
 - AfriNIC Last call
 - APNIC Adopted
 - ARIN Under discussion
 - LACNIC Back to the list for further discussion
 - RIPE NCC Under discussion


