PR #1

The GNSO Council should develop educational materials to illustrate the differences between the GNSO processes—PDP, EPDP, GGP, and GIP. The materials should concentrate on clarifying the circumstances under which each of the mechanisms is most appropriate. The materials should also provide clarity around the procedural differences among all of the mechanisms, which will help set expectations for the duration of the work when selecting each mechanism.

The GGP Manual should be modified to require the development and approval of a Charter for the GGP. The structure of the Charter for the GGP may be similar to the Charter for a PDP or EPDP.

GIP


GIP has never been used before; difficult to analyze its effectiveness.
